

## Number of Population as of January 1, 2015

As of January 1, 2015, the population of Georgia equaled 3,729.5 thousand persons<sup>1</sup>. The data is based on the preliminary results of General Population Census 2014 and the population increase (natural increase and net migration) data for the last 2 months of 2014.

57.5% of the population live in urban areas and 42.6% (1589,2 thousand persons) in rural areas.

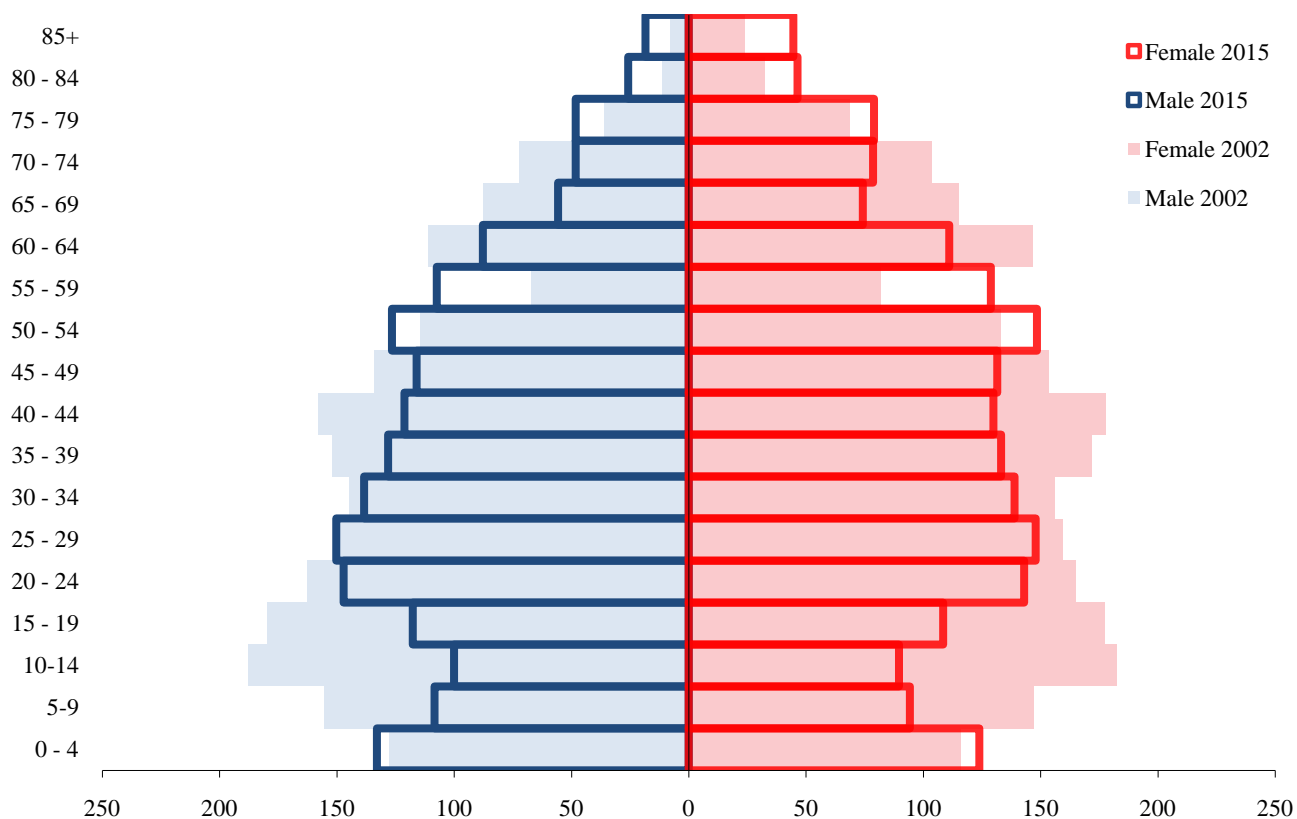
As of January 1, 2015, men constituted 47,7% (1 778,5 thousand persons) and women - 52,3% (1 951,0 thousand persons) of the total population.

The number of population in the inter-census period (2002-2014) decreased by 14.7%. This change was reflected in the sex and age structure. Over this period the share of men increased by 0,5 percentage points. Changes in the age structure are uneven. Population increase in the 0-4 age group is caused by a sharp increase in live births of both sexes from 2009. The biggest increase was registered in male and female age groups of 50-59. While the biggest decrease was observed for both sexes in the age group of 10-19. Minor decreases or increases were found in the remaining age groups.

In 2014 the number of emigrants equaled 88 704 thousand persons, which is 6,7% less than in the previous year, while the number of immigrants decreased by 11,1%, equaling 82 161 thousand persons over the same period. In 2014 the net migration (difference between the number of emigrants and immigrants) was negative (-6543).

### Emigrants and Immigrants by Age and Sex, 2014

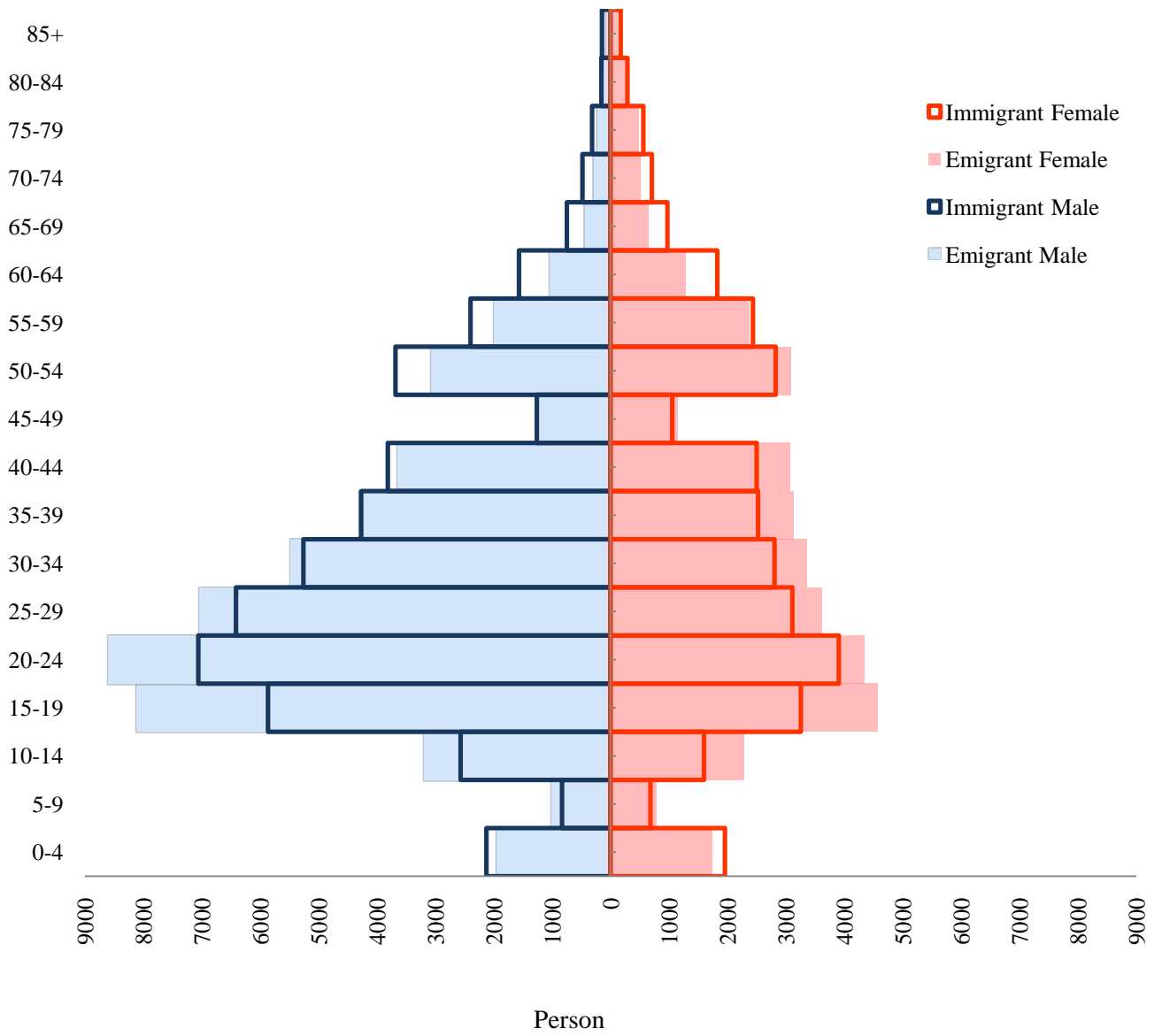

### Emigrants and Immigrants by Citizenship, 2014

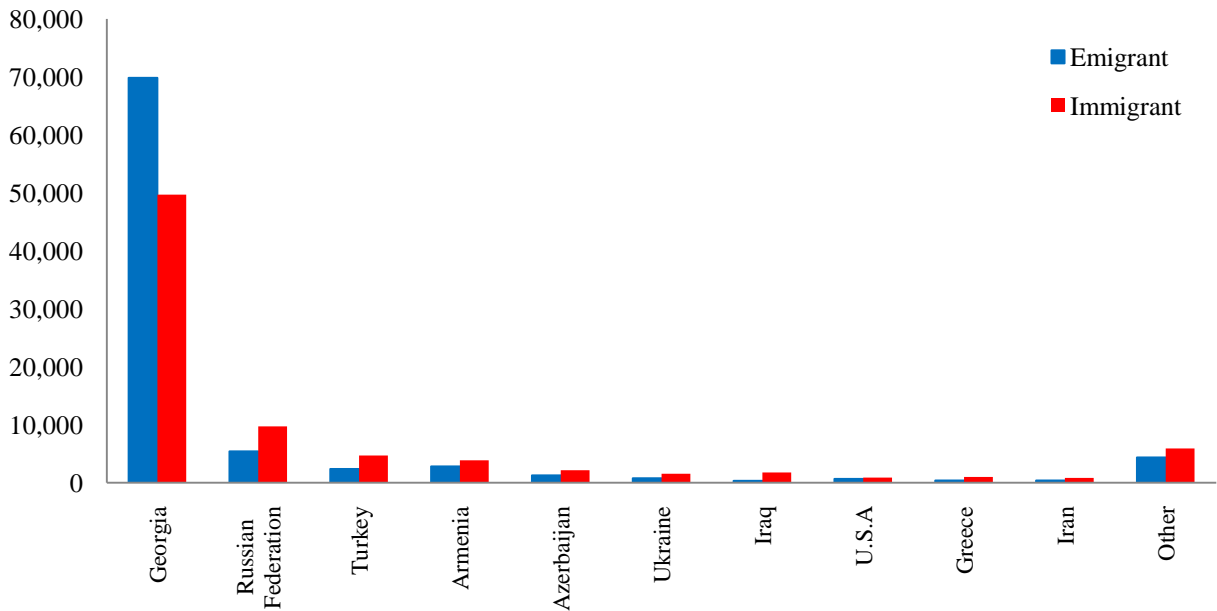
